LIFE Lutheran Services offers senior care center on West Shore

Mechanicsburg, PA — June 25, 2013 — LIFE Lutheran Services, Inc., a community-based program that serves seniors with chronic care needs, recently hosted an open house and celebrated its expansion into the West Shore with a ribbon cutting ceremony with the Mechanicsburg Chamber of Commerce.

The organization, a ministry of Lutheran Social Services of South Central Pennsylvania, is a “creative program designed to enhance the ability of seniors to live in their homes and communities with dignity and independence.” Founded in 2008 in Chambersburg, LIFE Lutheran Services enrolls seniors who are age 55 or older that need a nursing home level-of-care but want to stay in their homes. The organization offers preventative, primary, acute and long-term care services, as well as specialty services, prescription drugs and medical transportation. The majority of the services are provided at the new LIFE center, although home-based care is also available. The Center, open Monday through Friday, offers seniors a home-like and safe environment and includes areas for medical treatment and rehabilitation, personal care, dining and recreation. LIFE program participants attend the Center anywhere from 1 to 5 days per week, depending on their needs.

The new 30,000 square foot LIFE center is housed within the former Shaull Elementary School building, located at 1920 Good Hope Road in Enola.
