Unique special events facility opens in Mechanicsburg

August 22, 2013 – Mid-staters now have another special events venue option in Mechanicsburg. Strock Enterprises, Inc. has recently opened *The Catering Barn* and celebrated its grand opening with an open house and ribbon cutting ceremony with the Mechanicsburg Chamber of Commerce.

Strock Enterprises, Inc., a local farm fresh meats catering company based in Upper Allen Township, restored the 19th century barn as a venue for special events. Kent noted that it took a little over a year to complete the project. The 175-year old barn is constructed of chestnut, oak, pine and cherry lumber. Although the barn now boasts modern features such as heating, air conditioning and handicap accessible restrooms, the Strocks noted that it was important to them to use as much of the original features and materials as possible.

Specializing in large group gatherings such as weddings, showers, parties, and corporate functions, the venue holds a capacity of up to 200 people. The all-season facility is handicap accessible and offers abundant convenient parking.
