## Downtown Mechanicsburg welcomes new restaurant

Mechanicsburg, PA — November 4, 2015 — The Wicked Kitchen, a family-owned and operated restaurant and catering company, recently celebrated its grand opening in downtown Mechanicsburg with a ribbon cutting ceremony with the Mechanicsburg Chamber of Commerce.

The restaurant, a BYOB establishment, opened its doors in late September and is quickly becoming known around town for its homemade, Pennsylvania Dutch-inspired cuisine. “I’m thrilled to be here in Mechanicsburg bringing fresh, made-from-scratch dishes to the community,” said owner Cissy Beauvais.

For lunch, diners can expect a variety of paninis and sandwiches, including the Sweet BLT Club, a house favorite made with thick candied bacon and house bread. (All bread and pastries are made by hand and baked on site.) Beauvais also offers an array of soups, with a different soup being featured each day. Soups include PA Dutch chicken pot-pie, vegetable beef, chicken corn, French onion, tomato basil, and chili, which is offered daily. After 5pm, a dinner entree is offered in addition to the regular lunch menu. Entrees include hearty favorites like chicken and waffles, lasagna, macaroni and cheese with stewed tomatoes, and crab cakes. The Wicked Kitchen is located in the heart of downtown Mechanicsburg at 30 South Market Street. The restaurant is open Monday and Tuesday 11am-3pm; Wednesday-Friday 11am-7pm.
