Pennsylvania's Shared-Work program is a great tool that allows an employer to temporarily reduce the work hours of a group of employees while supplementing their lost wages with partial unemployment benefits rather than laying off any employees.

Employees covered by the Shared-Work plan receive a percentage of their unemployment compensation

(UC) weekly benefit amount while they work the reduced schedule, if they are otherwise eligible for UC.

Shared-Work plans empower employers to retain a trained and qualified workforce during periods of slowdown, and quickly ramp up operations without the expense of recruiting, hiring, and training new employees.

### What qualifications are required for participation?

To participate in Pennsylvania's Shared-Work program, the employer must have filed all UC tax reports and paid all amounts due under PA UC Law, have a positive reserve account balance (for contributory employers) and have paid wages for the last 12 consecutive guarters, according to the department's Office of UC Tax Services.



### The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

has prepared a readiness guide to help employers with 100 or more employees be prepared to

implement the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) for COVID-19 vaccination or testing.

On December 18, 2021, OSHA released guidance that it will resume implementation of the ETS.

Per OSHA: "OSHA will not issue citations for noncompliance with any requirements of the ETS before January 10 and will not issue citations for noncompliance with the standard's testing requirements before February 9, so long as an employer is exercising reasonable, good faith efforts to come into compliance with the standard." Litiga-

tion may be ongoing. Employers should refer to the OSHA website for updated guidance.

Employers must choose how to ensure compliance. Federal guidance states that employers can mandate vaccinations for staff. To support vaccinations, the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PADOH) will continue to oversee a Commonwealth-wide vaccination program, and employers are invited to refer any staff seeking vaccination to one of hundreds of clinics in the Commonwealth providing vaccines. To find the closest vaccine provider, please follow this link. PADOH will not provide any customized support to private employers seeking to operationalize a testing program.

### FREE TAX PREPARATIO

Make \$58,000 or less last year? You are eligible to receive FREE tax preparation through the Money in Your Pocket (MIYP) program. Review the following information BEFORE arriving at a site.

You MUST bring the following documents to have your taxes prepared:

- Valid photo ID (driver's license, military ID, etc.) for taxpaver and spous
- Original Social Security card or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) for you, your spouse, your children and other dependents included in your tax return.
- Your <u>current</u> Identity Protection PIN number issued by the IRS (if you have one) for <u>each year's</u> taxes that you need prepared.
- Printed copies of all year-end tax forms you have received in the mail. (We cannot use electronic files from phones.) If you received health care from the marketplace, bring your form 1095-A. (We cannot prepare your return without it.)

### Also bring the following information if it is available:

- Previous year's federal and state tax returns. (We can only access prior year returns for clients who used MIYP last year.)
- If you wish to have your refund deposited directly into your checking or savings account, bring a blank check or other documentation from your bank/credit union that shows your account number and the routing transit number.
- If you expect to claim a credit for child or dependent care, bring the child care provider's address and Employe Identification Number (EIN) or their Social Security number.

TAX PREPARATION WILL BEGIN ON JANUARY 31, 2022 AT THE FOLLOWING SITES:

### YOUR TAXES FOR FRE

Low- to moderate-income individuals and families with a yearly income of \$58,000 or less are eligible to receive FREE tax preparation from IRS certified volunteers through the Money in Your Pocket (MIYP) program.



- · The amount of money you get back depends on the amount you earned.
- To get a refund, you must file a tax return even if you don't owe anything.
- If you did not claim the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) in the past but were eligible, you can file an amendment at any time during the year for up to three previous tax years. You may be eligible for money you did not know about!
- · Refunds for e-filed returns that will be direct deposited are usually received in 10 days or less.

#### **TOUCH-FREE TAXES** FREE Remote Tax Preparation

Touch-Free Taxes is a free tax preparation. program which can be done from the comfort of your home by connecting you to a trained volunteer to complete your taxes. This is a fantastic option for people who are not ready for "in person" preparation.

#### **FEDERAL EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT ELIGIBILITY**

If you fit these guidelines, you are eligible for the Federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

- 1. You may not have investment income of more than \$10,000.
- 2. Your earned income in 2021 is equal to or less than incomes below:

Single Income	(filing jointly)
\$21,430	\$27,380
\$42,158	\$48,108
\$47,915	\$53,865
\$51,464	\$57,414
	\$21,430 \$42,158 \$47,915

- To be claimed, a child must meet relationship, age and residency requirements.
- For 2021 only, EITC is available to all clients age 19+ who meet the income eligibility.
