

## Local Share Account Statewide Grant Program for Non-Profits Available Through March 15

**Program Overview:** The PA Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (Act 2004-71), as amended, provides for the distribution of gaming revenues through the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) to support projects in the public interest within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

**Eligibility:** By state requirement, non-profit organizations are eligible to apply for funding for projects that improve the quality of life in the community. Applications must be submitted through an eligible applicant, such as Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation (CAEDC). For-profit entities are not eligible for this program.

### Eligible Uses of Funds:

- Acquisition
- Construction
- Demolition
- Infrastructure
- Purchase of vehicles, machinery and/or equipment
- Planning, consulting and design costs related to planning projects.
- Engineering, design and inspection, to include permitting fees, for construction projects not to exceed 10% of the total grant award.
- Administrative costs of the grantee for the purposes of administering the grant. Administrative costs may not exceed 2% of the total grant request.
- Contingency costs not to exceed 5% of documented construction and infrastructure costs.

**Funding:** Grants are available for projects with a total eligible project cost of \$25,000 or more. Grant requests shall not exceed \$1,000,000 for any project.


Renewable energy certificates (RECs) are one option for organizations looking to become more sustainable and meet renewable energy goals.

A REC is produced when a renewable energy source generates one megawatt-hour (MWh) of electricity and delivers it to the grid. RECs are certificates that then transfer the legal rights to the environmental attributes of that renewable energy to the purchaser (you). In other words, paired with electricity from the grid, renewable energy is being generated on your behalf.

# United Way of the Capital Region

## **FREE TAX PREPARATION!**

Make \$58,000 or less last year? You are eligible to receive FREE tax preparation through the Money in Your Pocket (MIYP) program. Review the following information BEFORE arriving at a site.

- You MUST bring the following documents to have your taxes prepared:
- Valid photo ID (driver's license, military ID, etc.) for taxpayer and spouse.
- <u>Original</u> Social Security card or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) for you, your spouse, your children and other dependents included in your tax return.
- Your <u>current</u> Identity Protection PIN number issued by the IRS (if you have one) for <u>each year's</u> taxes that you need prepared.
  Printed copies of all year-end tax forms you have received in the mail. (We cannot use electronic files from phones.)
- If you received health care from the marketplace, bring your form 1095-A. (We cannot prepare your return without it.)

#### Also bring the following information if it is available:

• Previous year's federal and state tax returns. (We can only access prior year returns for clients who used MIYP last year.)

- If you wish to have your refund deposited directly into your checking or savings account, bring a blank check or other documentation from your bank/credit union that shows your account number and the routing transit number.
- If you expect to claim a credit for child or dependent care, bring the child care provider's address and Employe Identification Number (EIN) or their Social Security number.

TAX PREPARATION WILL BEGIN ON JANUARY 31, 2022 AT THE FOLLOWING SITES:

## YOUR TAXES FOR FREE!

Low- to moderate-income individuals and families with a yearly income of \$58,000 or less are eligible to receive FREE tax preparation from IRS certified volunteers through the Money in Your Pocket (MIYP) program.

- The amount of money you get back depends on the amount you earned.
- To get a refund, you must file a tax return even if you don't owe anything.
- If you did not claim the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) in the past but were eligible, you can file an amendment at any time during the year for up to three previous tax years. You may be eligible for money you did not know about!
- Refunds for e-filed returns that will be direct deposited are usually received in 10 days or less.

#### TOUCH-FREE TAXES FREE Remote Tax Preparation

Touch-Free Taxes is a free tax preparation program which can be done from the comfort of your home by connecting you to a trained volunteer to complete your taxes. This is a fantastic option for people who are not ready for "in person" preparation.

#### FEDERAL EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT ELIGIBILITY

If you fit these guidelines, you are eligible for the Federal Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

 You may not have investment income of more than \$10,000.
 Your earned income in 2021 is equal to or less than incomes below:

Children	Single Income	Married (filing jointly)
No children**	\$21,430	\$27,380
1 child*	\$42,158	\$48,108
2 children	\$47,915	\$53,865
3 or more children	\$51,464	\$57,414

\* To be claimed, a child must meet relationship, age and residency requirements.

\*\* For 2021 <u>only</u>, EITC is available to all clients age 19+ who meet the income eligibility.
