

Local Nonprofits Invited to Strengthen Their Storytelling Through TFEC and Wakeen & Company Partnership

Local nonprofits now have the opportunity to build their communications capacity and share their impact through Stories That Serve, a new program created in partnership by The Foundation for Enhancing Communities (TFEC) and Wakeen & Company. The program offers one nonprofit a custom professional video package designed to help the organization tell its story, strengthen donor relationships and reach new audiences.

Applications are open through Nov. 17 at www.tfec.org/stories-that-serve.

As nonprofits face mounting financial pressures, many organizations are being asked to do more with less. The sector is seeing rising demand for services while budgets are delayed and restricted. Emerging trends show that nonprofits must now also contend with expanding issues such as workforce shortages, increasing operational costs and intensified expectations around social and environmental impact.

"Nonprofits spend every day giving back to our community," said Kevin Wert, chief engagement officer and partner at Wakeen & Company. "This is our opportunity to give back to them with the same heart and dedication they show others."

In this environment, Stories That Serve offers a timely and practical resource to help nonprofits amplify their message and inspire community support.

"Every nonprofit has a story worth telling, but nonprofits often lack the resources to tell it," said Jennifer Doyle, president and CEO at TFEC. "Through Stories That Serve, we're helping organizations communicate their work in a way that strengthens relationships, inspires giving and builds long-term capacity."

The selected nonprofit will work closely with Wakeen & Company to produce a four to five-minute feature video showcasing their story, as well as a 30-second social cutdown. The project will include concept development, filming and two rounds of revisions. Final video assets will be optimized for use across web and social platforms.

Production will begin in January with filming in February and a premiere event in March. The nonprofit's branding will appear prominently in the final video alongside a call to action of its choice.

"This initiative isn't just about one video," Doyle said. "It's about giving organizations the tools to share their mission more effectively and connect with their community for years to come."

Community Members Invited to Vote on Ideas to Strengthen Central Pennsylvania

Public voting for TFEC's SPARK! contest open through Oct. 26

Residents across South Central Pennsylvania now have an opportunity to direct change in their community by helping decide which ideas will receive funding through The Foundation for Enhancing Communities' (TFEC) SPARK! community contest.

More than 50 ideas were submitted during the first phase of the contest, reflecting the creativity and compassion of people across the region. SBA Offers Disaster Relief to Pennsylvania Small Businesses and Private Nonprofits Affected by Drought and Excessive Heat

Low interest disaster loans now available

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced the availability of low interest federal disaster loans to small businesses and private nonprofit (PNP) organizations in Pennsylvania who sustained economic losses caused by drought and excessive heat that occurred June 17-July 18, 2024

The disaster declaration covers the counties of Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Lancaster and York in Pennsylvania as well as Baltimore, Carroll and Harford counties in Maryland.

Under this declaration, the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program is available to eligible small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, nurseries, and PNPs with financial losses directly related to this disaster. The SBA is unable to provide disaster loans to agricultural producers, farmers, or ranchers, except for aquaculture enterprises.

EIDLs are available for working capital needs caused by the disaster and are available even if the small business or PNP did not suffer any physical damage. The loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills not paid due to the disaster.

"Through a declaration by the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, SBA provides critical financial assistance to help communities recover," said Chris Stallings, associate administrator of the Office of Disaster Recovery and Resilience at the SBA. "We're pleased to offer loans to small businesses and private nonprofits impacted by these disasters."

The loan amount can be up to \$2 million with interest rates as low as 4% for small businesses and 3.25% for PNPs, with terms up to 30 years. Interest does not accrue, and payments are not due until 12 months from the date of the first loan disbursement. The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant's financial condition.

For people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or have a speech disability, please dial 7-1-1 to access telecommunications relay services.

The deadline to return economic injury applications is April 20, 2026.

However, there are several steps to take to protect your business — here are a few to consider as you safeguard your data.

1. Encrypt Sensitive Data

Encryption provides a strong layer of defense against data breaches. It scrambles information to conceal its true content, and can only be "decoded" by using a decryption key held by an authorized party, making it useless to third parties who may intercept the data.

Here's an example of how encryption works in practice during a credit card transaction:

- 1. A customer makes a purchase at a point of sale using their credit card.
- 2. The transaction information (including the cards' payment data) is encrypted, and then sent to the payment processor.
- 3. The payment processor decrypts the payment information to authorize the transaction.
- 4. The transaction successfully completes.

Data encryption can be used to protect your business' sensitive data — such as payment information, of course, but also personally identifiable information for you and your employees, as well as your business' intellectual property.

Pro tips:

- When you're selecting a payment processing solution, ensure you choose one that is PCI
 Compliant. This means that the system meets industry-wide security standards to keep your
 customers' payment information safe.
- Consider selecting a solution that allows you to accept digital wallets, such as Apple Pay and Google Pay. Digital wallets provide an extra layer of security during transactions, allowing customers to make a purchase without sharing their information with merchants directly.
- Make sure you set up a VPN for all computer access to the Internet. This enables you to encrypt all online communications, sending them through a tunnel to create an additional layer of privacy.

2. Keep Your Systems Updated

Cybercriminals are continually devising new ways to steal sensitive data, which means new security threats pop up daily. As a result, using out-of-date technologies or failing to keep up with software updates may leave you vulnerable to a cyberattack.

Keeping your technology up to date helps ensure you continually have access to the latest protection. Regularly review and patch systems, applications and devices to eliminate any vulnerable pathways. If you're not comfortable doing this yourself, or with the IT expertise already on your team, consider budgeting for an IT consultant to occasionally check the health of your systems and manage security. It's also advisable to purchase off-the-shelf products that will enable things like firewalls and virus detection. These systems help add layers of protection and monitoring for anomalies.

3. Develop an Emergency Response Plan

Of course, even updated and compliant systems can't eliminate the risk of cyberattaccks entirely — so it's important to have an emergency response plan to help you plan how you would recover if attacked. This approach means you hope for the best but plan for the worst.

It's critical for businesses of all sizes to effectively plan for, respond to, manage and mitigate the damage caused by cyber incidents to help to protect data, assets and operations. Simple things like keeping back-ups of data can go a long way in helping protect your business from a cyber attack, particularly if someone attacks and holds your data for ransom.

Emergency response planning should chart actions that allow you to:

- Minimize damage and reduce recovery time and costs.
- Protect sensitive data and maintain customer trust.
- Comply with legal and regulatory requirements.
- Ensure business continuity.

4. Establish Two-way Security Communication With Employees

Keeping your business secure requires pairing the right technologies with appropriate staff training. Nearly two-thirds of data breaches involve some sort of non-malicious human element, according to Verizon's 2024 Data Breach Investigations Report[3], which means you can help reduce the risk of a breach with proper education and a healthy means of communication.

For employees who operate digitally, find trainings on how to spot and report common phishing attempts. These trainings ensure employees are aware of common red flags, such as suspicious links or attachments, unusual requests from known entities, and emails from unknown email addresses impersonating customers or colleagues.

Have standard operating procedures in place for you to notify employees of any threats and for employees to respond to these threats and access security policies to identify the next best steps.

Pro Tip:

• If your business experiences a successful breach, file a report with the Internet Crime Complaint Center[4] as soon as possible.
