Pennsylvania's primary election is coming up on Tuesday, May 19. Voters will have the opportunity to choose their party's candidates for governor, lieutenant governor, U.S. House of Representatives, state House and Senate (in even-numbered senatorial districts), as well as state and local committee members.

Monday, May 4 is the deadline to register to vote. [You may register online here](#) or [visit your county voter registration office](#). Not sure of your registration status? [Check it here](#).

Tuesday, May 12, is the [deadline to apply for mail-in or absentee ballots](#), which also may be done online or at your [county elections office](#). Ballots must be completed and returned to your county election officials by 8 p.m. on May 19.

Watch Out for These Social Media Scams

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), people reported losing \$2.1 billion to social media scams in 2025.

Shopping scams were the most reported scam on social media. Scammers post ads offering high-priced items for cheap. If you click, you might end up on a site that's impersonating a well-known brand.

More than half of the reported losses came from investment scams. Scammers use ads and testimonials offering to teach you a fool-proof way to beat the stock market. But investing always comes with risk.

Nearly 60% of people who reported losing money to a romance scam in 2025 said it started on social media. Scammers use what's in your profile to build a connection only to later invent a problem that requires you to send them money.

To avoid scams on social media:

- Limit who can see your posts and contacts. Visit your privacy settings to set restrictions so scammers have less to work with.
- Never let someone you meet on social media direct your investment decisions. Instead, learn more about spotting investment scams.
- Before you buy, check out the company. Search online for its name plus "scam" or "complaint."

Hearing on Resource Adequacy, Energy Market, Barriers to New PA Power Generation



Continuing efforts to ensure Pennsylvania families and employers have access to reliable, affordable electricity, the Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committee held a public hearing to examine the latest energy market conditions and barriers to new power generation in the commonwealth.

The panel heard from testifiers representing the regional power grid, PJM, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and others. ReliabilityFirst, which is responsible for ensuring the dependability and security of the regional bulk power system, projected risk to grid reliability could come in 2029 instead of in the early 2030s as previously projected.

The surge of demand from data centers and the need for more skilled infrastructure workers were also discussed. [You can view written testimony and the hearing video here.](#)

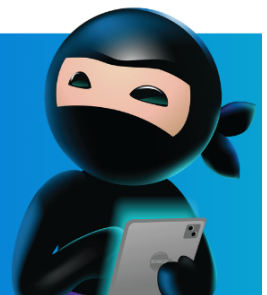

Harrisburg Hoopla Returns June 6 to Support Local Nonprofits

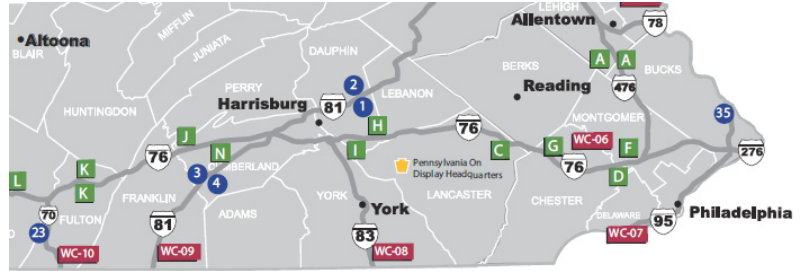

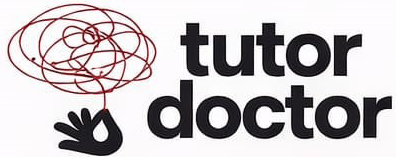

UPMC Hillman Cancer Center's New Radiation Option Expands Prostate Cancer Care for Central Pa. Patients

UPMC Hillman Cancer Center in central Pennsylvania, is now offering high dose rate (HDR) prostate brachytherapy at UPMC Hillman Cancer Center located at 4300 Londonderry Rd, Harrisburg, Pa. and is the only health facility in central Pennsylvania to currently offer this service.

High-dose-rate (HDR) prostate brachytherapy is a well-established form of radiation oncology therapy that delivers a high dose of radiation directly to the prostate while limiting exposure to nearby healthy tissue. It can be used on its own for patients with low or intermediate-risk prostate cancer or combined with external beam radiation therapy for patients with higher-risk disease.

"UPMC Hillman Cancer Center in Central Pa. continues to invest in advanced radiation technologies that improve treatment precision and patient experience," said Joella Wilson, M.D., regional vice chair, Radiation Oncology, UPMC Hillman Cancer Center. "As a National Cancer Institute Designated Cancer Center in central Pennsylvania, this milestone underscores our commitment to providing top-tier cancer care and innovative treatment options to our community."

The procedure involves the placement of thin catheters in the prostate using ultrasound guidance. This allows the radiation oncologists to precisely target the cancer while protecting surrounding organs such as the bladder and rectum. The patient is under general anesthesia and the procedure is typically performed as an outpatient treatment.

Liverpool, Pennsylvania resident Martin Roland, 71, was among the patients who received HDR prostate brachytherapy treatment and says he is pleased with the outcome.

"When my prostate-specific antigen, or PSA, numbers started rising more quickly, I knew it was time to act," Roland said. "After learning about my options and doing my own research, HDR brachytherapy felt like the right choice for me. The treatment fit my life and aside from taking a short break, I was able to get right back out on the golf course, which meant a lot to me."

UPMC Hillman Cancer Center in Central Pa. has approximately 40,000 patient visits for radiation oncology annually, delivering nearly 135 radiation treatments daily. It is one of just 57 National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Centers in the country, which provides cutting-edge treatment and access to hundreds of clinical trials.

CAEDC Awards Nearly \$1 Million in Tourism Grants for Cumberland County; 2026 Application Still Open

The Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation (CAEDC), through the Cumberland Valley Visitors Bureau, has awarded \$994,140 in tourism grant funding to support 14 projects across Cumberland County.

The funding is part of CAEDC's ongoing commitment to strengthening the region's tourism economy by enhancing visitor experiences, supporting local businesses, and investing in attractions that draw travelers to the Cumberland Valley. In 2025, CAEDC administered three grant programs: the Tourism Recovery Grant, Tourism Product Development Grant, and Destination Sales Grant.

A list of awarded projects is below:

2025 Tourism Product Development Grant

- Cumberland Valley Rails to Trails received a \$176,000 grant to assist with construction of a trail along Middle Spring Creek. The project will connect the Shippensburg Station trailhead of the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail to downtown Shippensburg.
- Destiny Dairy Bar received a \$152,777 grant to enhance visitor experiences on the farm. Improvements include a pavilion with shade, seating, and lighting, a food truck for on-farm dining, and a concrete entrance to the cow barn to improve access for strollers and children.
- Midway Bowl received a \$133,709 grant to update event rooms, add better seating and shade to the outdoor patio, and install new windows and an ADA-accessible door.
- Jubilee Cake Studio received an \$87,020 grant to expand the indoor play area playhouses, amusement equipment, and LED displays.
- The Event Cafe was awarded a \$76,586 grant for ADA accessibility upgrades and structural improvements.
- Shippensburg University received a \$74,000 grant to support new equipment purchases that will enhance performance quality at the H. Ric Luhrs Performing Arts Center.
- Shippensburg University Foundation received a \$25,260 grant to support the creation and installation of "Happy Birthday! America's Milestone Celebrations from Lafayette to Today," an exhibit celebrating the nation's 250th anniversary at the Shippensburg Fashion Archives.

2025 Tourism Recovery Grant

- Denim Coffee was awarded a \$10,000 grant for new furniture, a water filling station, butcher-block tabletops, and additional enhancements. [Denim Coffee's award was highlighted in a recent Success Story.](#)

- Williams Grove Historical Steam Engine Association received a \$5,819 grant to replace a 40-year-old sound system.

2025 Destination Sales Grant

- New Cumberland Olde Towne Association received a \$120,000 multi-year grant for the Iron Bridge Festival to support entertainment and event expenses.
- Innovation Management Consulting LLC received an \$89,812 multi-year grant for the PA Gospel Fest in Shippensburg to cover artist fees and related expenses.
- Carlisle Family YMCA was awarded a \$24,155 grant for the Carlisle Crush Volleyball Tournament, supporting field maintenance and facility upgrades.
- Pennsylvania Junior Wrestling received a \$12,000 grant to assist with hiring officials and renting timing equipment and mats for the Youth Championships.
- Professional Women and Women Entrepreneurs Association received a \$7,000 grant to assist with performance and venue fees for the Annual Gala Dinner at the Penn Harris Hotel.

Since the program began in 2010, more than \$4.2 million in tourism grant funding has been awarded to 237 projects.

2026 Tourism Grant Opportunities

CAEDC is currently accepting applications for its 2026 Tourism Grant program. Available opportunities include:

- **Tourism Product Development Grant:** Supports physical product development projects seeking between \$25,000 and \$500,000 for creating new tourism experiences that attract overnight visitors or provide experiences for visitors already in-market, including construction, furniture and fixtures, and equipment.
- **Tourism Partnership Grant:** Offers funding from \$2,500 to \$10,000 for smaller-scale product development projects that expand tourism products, experiences, or services designed to attract overnight visitors to Cumberland Valley.
- **Destination Sales Grant:** Provides \$3,000 to \$10,000 for multi-day event expenses, including bid fees, facility or shuttle rentals, speaker or performer fees, and marketing or advertising costs.

Tourism grant applications are reviewed quarterly. The next Tourism Grant Program application deadline is May 8, 2026. Grants are reviewed on a first-come, first-serve basis as funds are available. “CAEDC’s tourism grant program helps turn great ideas into visitor-focused experiences that strengthen Cumberland County’s appeal. By investing in projects that enhance attractions, events, and infrastructure, we’re driving tourism growth, supporting local businesses, and creating lasting economic impact for our community,” said CAEDC’s Director of Tourism and Marketing, Laura Delaney. SBA Offers Disaster Relief to Pennsylvania Small Businesses and Private Nonprofits Affected by Rainfall

Low interest disaster loans now available

The [U.S. Small Business Administration \(SBA\)](#) announced the availability of low interest federal disaster loans to small businesses and private nonprofit (PNP) organizations in Pennsylvania who sustained economic losses caused by the rainfall beginning May 2-July 17, 2025.

The disaster declaration covers the counties of Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Perry and York.

Under this declaration, the SBA's [Economic Injury Disaster Loan \(EIDL\)](#) program is available to eligible small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, nurseries, and PNPs with financial losses directly related to this disaster. The SBA is unable to provide disaster loans to agricultural producers, farmers, or ranchers, except for aquaculture enterprises.

EIDLs are available for working capital needs caused by the disaster and are available even if the small business or PNP did not suffer any physical damage. The loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills not paid due to the disaster.

“Through a declaration by the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, SBA provides critical financial assistance to help communities recover,” said Chris Stallings, associate administrator of the Office of Disaster Recovery and Resilience at the SBA. “We’re pleased to offer loans to small businesses and private nonprofits impacted by these disasters.”

The loan amount can be up to \$2 million with interest rates as low as 4% for small businesses and 3.625% for PNPs, with terms up to 30 years. Interest does not accrue, and payments are not due until 12 months from the date of the first loan disbursement. The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant’s financial condition.

The deadline to return economic injury applications is Sept. 29, 2026.
