For more than 43 years, New Hope Ministries has served as a source of hope for low-income individuals and families across central Pennsylvania. At our Mechanicsburg Center and through a network of ten mobile food pantry locations, we provide essential support to neighbors facing food insecurity, housing instability, transportation challenges, and barriers to employment.

As inflation, rising housing and healthcare costs, and economic uncertainty continue to impact our community, more families are finding themselves in crisis after a single unexpected expense or job loss. Through compassionate case management, emergency food assistance, housing support, and transportation services, New Hope Ministries helps guests stabilize their immediate situations while building a path toward long-term self-sufficiency.

Our programs also equip individuals with the skills needed to achieve lasting independence through workforce development training, GED preparation, financial literacy education, and certifications in high-demand career fields. Innovative programs like Hope Rides, which provides assistance with car repairs and temporary loaner vehicles, help remove transportation barriers that often stand in the way of employment.

By addressing both immediate needs and the underlying challenges that keep families in poverty, New Hope Ministries is helping Mechanicsburg-area neighbors build brighter, more stable futures filled with hope and opportunity.

New Hope has 10 locations across parts of 3 Counties covering nearly a half million people. The Mechanicsburg area is served by their location at 5228 E Trindle Rd. 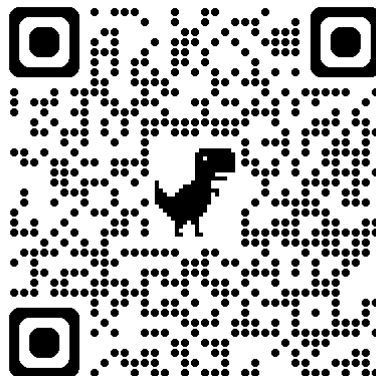

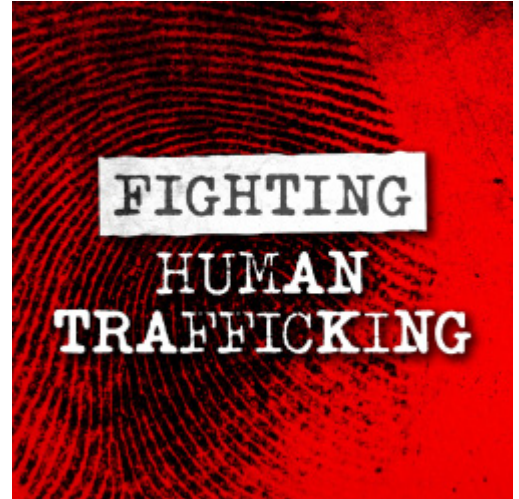
New Law to Boost Human Trafficking Awareness

Statistics show hotels, motels and short-term lodging rentals are some of the most common venues where human trafficking, specifically sex trafficking, take place. A new state law aims to stop that.

I recently voted in support of [Act 31 of 2026](#), which requires training to ensure employees of these establishments are prepared to identify and respond to suspected human trafficking as it occurs. The law takes effect in one year.

The measure is the latest effort by the General Assembly to stop this fast-growing crime. Another new law, [Act 41 of 2026](#), aims to help the Pennsylvania attorney general and law enforcement more effectively target and prosecute human trafficking by moving most of the state's prostitution offenses to the human trafficking section of the state Crimes Code and enhancing penalties. This law will take effect in 60 days.

Supporting Our Veterans

I recently joined in the unanimous support of a new state law that aims to improve services for veterans affected by military sexual trauma.

[Act 38 of 2026](#) will require county directors of veterans affairs to undergo additional training and certification in trauma-informed care, including military sexual trauma, post-traumatic stress disorder and traumatic brain injury. The goal is to help staff recognize symptoms, reduce potential triggers, and better connect veterans with appropriate services and resources.

According to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, nearly one in three women and one in 50 men in the armed forces report experiencing sexual assault or sexual harassment during military service. The actual number is believed to be higher because many incidents go unreported.

The law takes effect in 180 days.

PennDOT Seeking Workers for Winter Maintenance Program

While we are still feeling the summer heat, PennDOT is preparing for cooler temperatures by gearing up for its winter maintenance program.

Positions available may include CDL equipment operators, mechanics, dispatchers, tradesman helpers and semi-skilled laborers. The positions pay between \$17.73 per hour to \$28.94 per hour. The winter maintenance program runs from September through April.

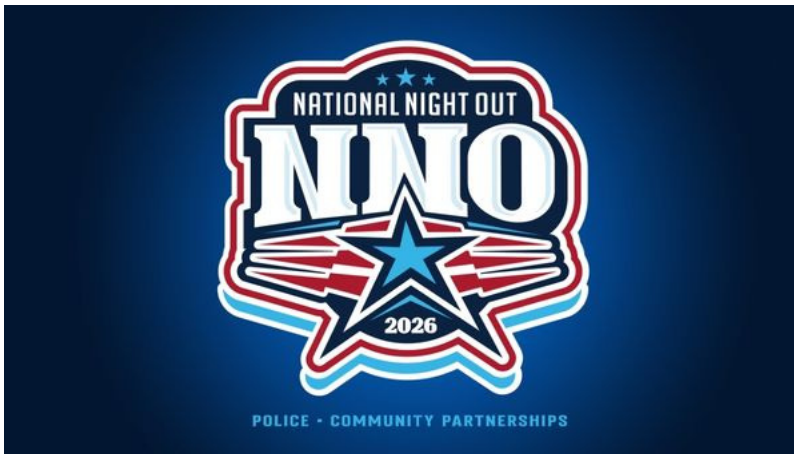
- Old bank statements, medical records, tax documents and other personal papers.

We are making progress in the never-ending fight against child predators and human trafficking in Pennsylvania.

[Senate Bill 45](#), which I supported and which was recently signed into law as Act 41 of 2026, will help Pennsylvania Attorney General Dave Sunday and law enforcement officials across the state target

and prosecute human trafficking more effectively. This is a huge step forward.

And in the new state budget, we also increased funding for two key programs overseen by AG Sunday – the Child Predator Interception Unit and the Human Trafficking Enforcement and Prevention program.

LSA Category 4 Grants Opened July 1

Non-Profits in Cumberland County Can Apply Through CAEDC

The Local Share Account (LSA), Category 4 Facilities Program, a multi-county grant program that includes Cumberland County opened July 1, and interested non-profit applicants can apply through the Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation (CAEDC).

CAEDC seeks applicants who are non-profit organizations that need funding for projects that benefit their community. Interested organizations are encouraged to contact Alyssa Smith at 717-240-7184 or at alyssa@cumberlandbusiness.com with any questions and to determine if their project aligns with CAEDC's strategic mission.

Eligible uses include:

- Acquisition
- Construction
- Demolition
- Infrastructure
- Purchase of vehicles, machinery and/or equipment (excluding uniforms, protective equipment, consumable supplies, and furniture)
- Planning, consulting, and design costs related to planning projects.
- Engineering, design, and inspection, to include permitting fees, for construction projects not to exceed 10% of the total grant award
- Contingency costs not to exceed 5% of documented construction and infrastructure costs are permissible

Interested, qualified applicants can apply on CAEDC's online application at CumberlandBusiness.com/lsa-application.

Complete applications must be submitted to CAEDC by August 31, 2026.

The LSA Grant is funded through the PA Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (Act 2004-71), as amended, which provides for the distribution of gaming revenues through the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) to support projects in the public interest within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Cost Caps to Know: Engineering, design & inspection costs are capped at **10% of the total grant award** (no cap for planning-only projects). Administrative costs may not exceed **2%** of the total grant request. Contingency costs are capped at **5%** of documented construction and infrastructure costs.

Eligibility Requirement: Projects must improve the quality of life for citizens and provide a public benefit. Eligible projects must be owned and maintained by an eligible applicant or nonprofit organization.

The Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation (CAEDC) seeks a county resident or person employed by a business in Cumberland County who would be interested in serving on the CAEDC Board of Directors. CAEDC is looking for a community-minded candidate working in the Hospitality, Tourism, or Destination Marketing Industry to fill a vacant position for a remainder of a 3-year term.

The Board of Directors includes the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and 11 additional Directors who are tasked with evaluating day-to-day operations. Board Members contribute to board meetings, provide input on strategic decisions, participate on a committee, and support the organization's mission.

Board service requires attendance at bi-monthly meetings, participation on a CAEDC committee, and attendance at CAEDC-sponsored events.
