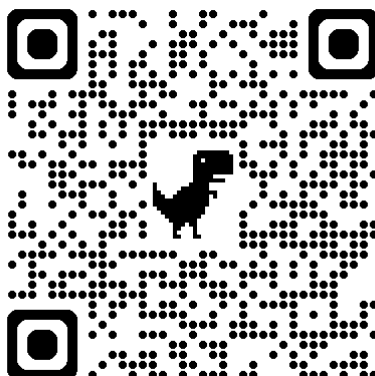

Earlier this summer, House Republicans voted to treat data centers like any other business in the Commonwealth by overwhelmingly supporting [House Bill 2198](#). This bill would repeal tax breaks for data centers.

Additionally, this week, the governor issued an executive order regarding data center parameters. When the House returns to session, I expect further discussion about this issue. I remain committed to setting fair standards that protect taxpayers, as well as the environment, shielding ratepayers from higher energy costs related to development, and ensuring decisions about data centers are made at the local level.

Taking Action to Prevent School Truancy and Support Families



September is Truancy Prevention Month, a time to raise awareness about chronic absenteeism and the challenges it creates for students, families and schools. Under Pennsylvania law, a student is considered truant after three unexcused absences and habitually truant after six unexcused absences in a school year. However, how truancy is identified and addressed can vary among school districts, creating inconsistencies for families.

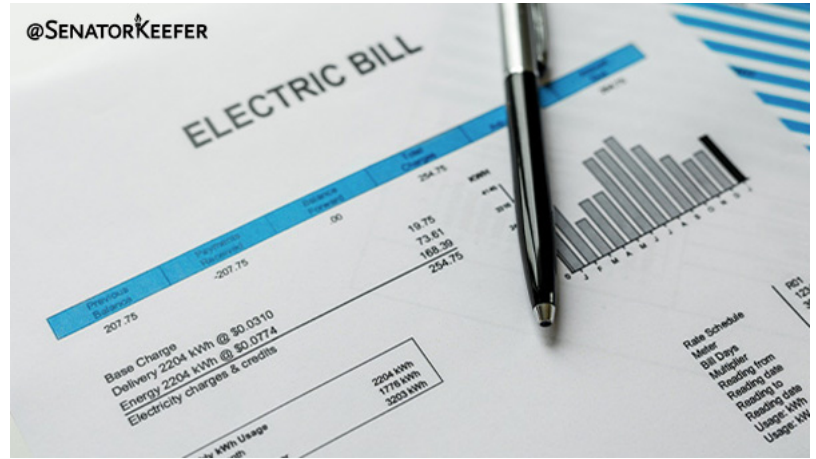
My [Senate Bill 1387](#) would provide greater clarity and consistency while protecting parents' ability to choose the educational setting that best meets their child's needs. Act 47 of 2025 prevents students classified as habitually truant from enrolling in a public cyber charter school without judicial approval, creating an unnecessary barrier to an educational option that may better serve some students and prevent truancy. My legislation would remove that judicial requirement, establish consistent attendance policies between traditional brick-and-mortar schools and cyber charter schools, ensure parents receive timely notice of attendance concerns, and provide families with resources to address chronic absenteeism.

Parents, not bureaucrats, should have a meaningful voice in determining the educational environment that works best for their children.

Strategies to Prevent Electric Bill Spikes Highlighted at Senate Hearing

Strategies to increase energy production and lower utility bills for Pennsylvanians were the focus of a public hearing by the Senate Majority Policy Committee.

The committee heard from energy generators, utilities, business groups, taxpayer advocates and more. Pennsylvania is the top electricity exporter and supplier of natural gas, but the retirement of generation sources is driving up prices and risking electric grid reliability.



Testifiers noted the commonwealth needs to build more reliable baseload generation to keep prices stable and ensure access to energy. [Read more and access hearing video here.](#)

TFEC Grant Cycle 3 Offers Nonprofits Up to \$38,000 in Funding

Eligible local nonprofits can apply for up to \$38,000 to strengthen their programs and expand the services they provide in their communities through The Foundation for Enhancing Communities' (TFEC) current grant opportunities.

"Local nonprofits understand the needs of the people and neighborhoods they serve," said Stefani McAuliffe, vice president of community impact at TFEC. "This funding can help them advance their missions, reach more people and build on the work already making a difference across our region." Grant Cycle 3 offers five funding opportunities, with individual awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$12,000. Nonprofits may apply to more than one opportunity if they meet the eligibility requirements.

Applications are open through Tuesday, Sept. 1.

The **Madden Family Foundation Fund** offers grants of up to \$5,000 for programs that support disadvantaged mothers with children in South Central Pennsylvania and northern York County.

The **Martin M. Sacks Memorial Fund** offers grants of up to \$1,000 for youth and family programs serving disadvantaged or underserved communities.

The **Mechanicsburg Area Community Foundation Grant** offers up to \$12,000 to nonprofits serving the 17050 and 17055 ZIP codes. Funding supports programs that improve quality of life in the Mechanicsburg area, including efforts that strengthen housing stability.

The **Please Live Fund** offers up to \$10,000 for mental health education and suicide prevention in Pennsylvania. The fund gives special consideration to programs serving students from kindergarten through college.

TFEC Community Impact Grants offer up to \$10,000 for work that responds to local needs and strengthens communities across South Central Pennsylvania.

Applications must be submitted online by Sept. 1. Applicants will be notified of their status by Tuesday, Dec. 1.

Eligible applicants must have nonprofit status or work with an eligible fiscal sponsor. Organizations may apply for multiple opportunities, but they may submit only one application to each grant program.

Nonprofits can review full guidelines and apply through TFEC's [current grant opportunities portal](#). Questions about eligibility or the application process can be directed to grants@tfec.org or 717-236-5040.

"These grant funds reflect the generosity of people who want to make a lasting difference in the causes and communities they care about," said Kim Alvarez, vice president of philanthropy at TFEC. "Donors can support an established fund through TFEC or create a charitable fund that reflects their own goals. Each gift helps expand what is possible for local nonprofits and the people they serve."

LSA Category 4 Grants Opened July 1

Non-Profits in Cumberland County Can Apply Through CAEDC

The Local Share Account (LSA), Category 4 Facilities Program, a multi-county grant program that includes Cumberland County opened July 1, and interested non-profit applicants can apply through the Cumberland Area Economic Development Corporation (CAEDC).

CAEDC seeks applicants who are non-profit organizations that need funding for projects that benefit their community. Interested organizations are encouraged to contact Alyssa Smith at 717-240-7184 or at alyssa@cumberlandbusiness.com with any questions and to determine if their project aligns with CAEDC's strategic mission.

Eligible uses include:

- Acquisition
- Construction
- Demolition
- Infrastructure
- Purchase of vehicles, machinery and/or equipment (excluding uniforms, protective equipment, consumable supplies, and furniture)
- Planning, consulting, and design costs related to planning projects.
- Engineering, design, and inspection, to include permitting fees, for construction projects not to exceed 10% of the total grant award
- Contingency costs not to exceed 5% of documented construction and infrastructure costs are permissible

Interested, qualified applicants can apply on CAEDC's online application at CumberlandBusiness.com/lsa-application.

Complete applications must be submitted to CAEDC by August 31, 2026.

The LSA Grant is funded through the PA Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (Act 2004-71), as amended, which provides for the distribution of gaming revenues through the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) to support projects in the public interest within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Cost Caps to Know: Engineering, design & inspection costs are capped at **10% of the total grant award** (no cap for planning-only projects). Administrative costs may not exceed **2%** of the total grant request. Contingency costs are capped at **5%** of documented construction and infrastructure costs.

Eligibility Requirement: Projects must improve the quality of life for citizens and provide a public benefit. Eligible projects must be owned and maintained by an eligible applicant or nonprofit organization.

The State Transportation Commission (STC), PennDOT, and Pennsylvania's Metropolitan and Rural Planning Organizations (MPOs and RPOs) are excited to announce the availability of Pennsylvania's adopted 2027 12-Year Transportation Program (TYP).

Your support of Pennsylvania's TYP update process is greatly appreciated and valued by the STC. Your review and input of statewide transportation projects help us to improve Pennsylvania's transportation infrastructure, enhance safety, and develop modern mobility solutions.

The TYP is PennDOT's official mid-range planning tool, which lists statewide planned projects across all modes of transportation and assigns funding over a 12-year period. Pennsylvania State Law, Act 120 of 1970, as amended, requires PennDOT to prepare, update, and submit Pennsylvania's TYP every two years to the STC.

The STC adopted the 2027 TYP on August 5, 2026. [View the 2027 TYP on our website](#) to see which transportation projects are planned in Pennsylvania over the next 12 years.

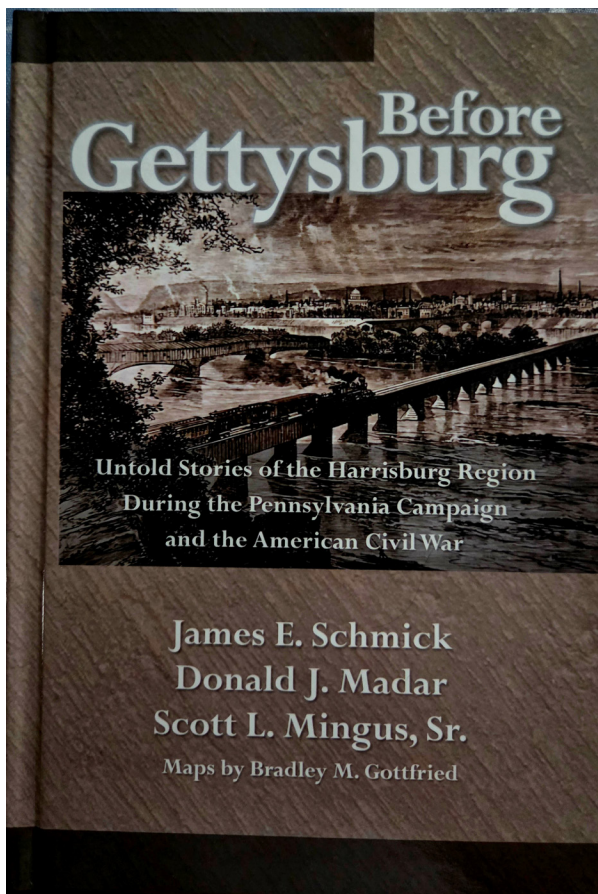

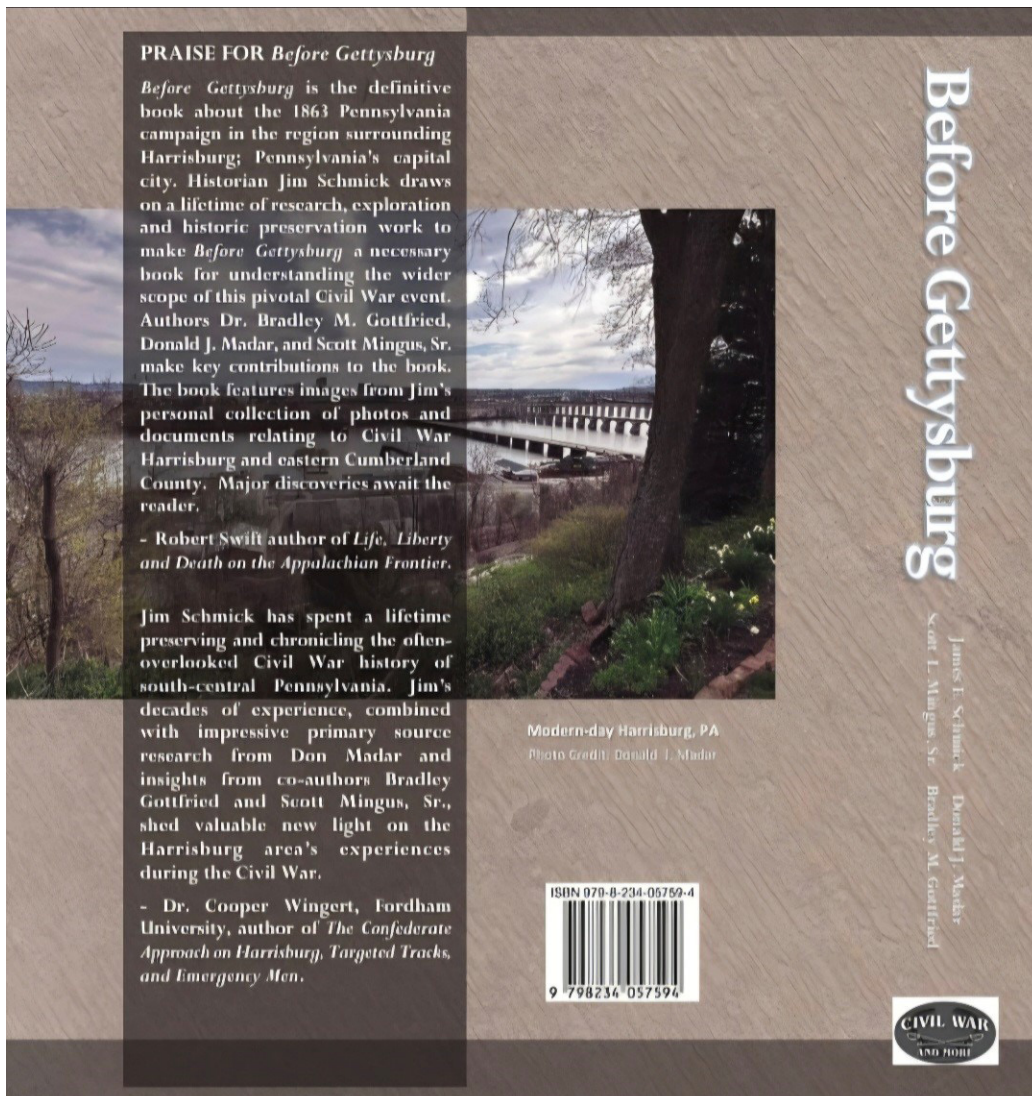
